

FY2024 Funding Plan: Student Wellness and Success

Identification of Need/Goals/Strategies – Student Wellness & Success Funds

The Licking Valley Local School District is committed to providing physical, mental, safety & security services to students during the school day to readily address student needs. We plan to implement strategies and programs through our nurses, counselors, social workers, school resource officer, and physical education teachers.

Goal:

- Students will be physically, socially, and intellectually safe.

Strategies:

- School environments are developed and sustained as places where all are cared for, valued, and respected.
- Learning opportunities, educational resources, support is accessible to all students.

Plan for the use of the Funds – Allocation:\$403,845.16

The Student Wellness and Success funds for FY2024 will be used in the following ways:

- A. *Mental Health Services*- Guidance Counselors & Social Workers K-12 alongside Behavior Health Partners (BHP-community) offer coordinated counseling services to students on a scheduled and as needed basis to help students overcome barriers to learning for preventative through the ROX & Evolve, social/emotional learning- teaching identification and self-regulation strategies. Services are offered to all students to empower them, build confidence, help set healthy boundaries, and develop positive relationships, violence prevention & leadership skills.

- B. *Physical Health Services*- Physical Health services provided by Physical Education Teachers with Health, Weight Training, and PE curriculums. Through partnership with Licking Memorial Hospital, certified school nurse staff provide CPR/first aid training to high school student vape, STD, and puberty education with middle & high school students in these classes as well as providing acute medical care, hearing/vision screenings, and managing health records, and health plans on an on-going basis to students K-12.

C. *Safety & Security*- The School Resource Officer provides K-12 cyber security classes throughout the year on topics such as safety, online threats, and online awareness. The SRO plays a prominent role in all district threat assessments teams, as well as daily security.
