State graduation standards and testing at LVHS, by Wes Weaver, Principal of LVHS

Licking Valley High School teachers, administrators and counselors are working hard to ensure every member of the class of 2018 meets state graduation requirements. New requirements including earning at least 18 of 35 points on seven graduation tests and meeting local requirements.

The imposition of the new requirements will lead to a dramatic decrease in graduation rates across the state of Ohio; LV administrators were among the first of many school officials to call

attention to this problem with the State Board of Education. In response, the state board

At LVHS, among our 165 seniors, 73% have met the 18-point requirement as of October, 2017. Among the 27% not earning 18 points, 4% will meet career-technical requirements at C-TEC and earn a diploma;

another 4% qualify to be exempt from the 18-point requirement because of a learning disability. We are working with the remaining students in the following ways:

Providing subject-specific remediation in remediation classes for every test.

Providing re-testing opportunities in December for students who need to improve scores in one or more areas. Communicating with students and parents about the alternative pathways and providing information about the alternative pathways. Monitoring the progress of all students to ensure they meet one of the graduation options.

The next re-testing opportunity is the Fall 2017 testing period: we'll be testing students on December 5th, 7th, 12th and 14th. Late-start schedules **will not** be used on those days; students will be absent from classes for testing. LVHS will utilize a late-start schedule for testing in the Spring, when all of our sophomores and freshmen will take

one or more of their tests for the first time; tentatively, we'll use a three -hour delay schedule on April 19th, 24th, 26th and May 1st.


Tests originally created under the PARCC (Partnership for the Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) consortium continue to be the most difficult. Ohio-specific tests based on Ohio standards actually have passage rates much closer to that of the old tests, called the Ohio Graduation Tests. The top three toughest tests at LVHS (mirrors state data) are Geometry, English Language Arts 2, and Algebra.

The state board of education has convened another committee to examine graduation requirements and LV administrators continue to monitor the political and bureaucratic movements that impact our students. Our stance was - and is - that if standardized testing is to be used as a graduation requirement, tests should be valid and reliable and schools should receive detailed feedback on student performance, with 100% release of test items so we can improve the way we're teaching and assessing.

Instructional time lost due to testing continues to be a concern. As the graphic shows, the Fall testing period alone gobbled up more than 2,000 teacher / administrator / student hours last August-December.



It has been a busy first grading period here at the middle school with our full-scale conversion to a standards-based learning system. Now that the grading period is completed we are preparing to send home grade reports on Thursday, November 2nd . Unlike years past when we mailed home progress reports, all of our students will be bringing home an envelope on November 2nd. Students will be instructed to give the packet to parents and I ask each of you to sign and return the cardstock receipt on Friday, November 3rd showing you have received it. This packet will include a grade card, the Jumprope standards report from each class, and their Fall 2017 MAP testing data. I would ask, just as I did at the parent meetings in August, to pay particular attention to the college-career readiness ratings that your student has received in each class. As I talked at length about in those meetings I believe that these indicators are paramount for our students to be successful in their current academic setting and will become even more important as they progress towards high school and beyond. Should you have guestions about standards-based learning and reporting system now in place district-wide I would encourage you to refer back to the materials we covered in August and that are also accessible on our building website. As always should you desire to discuss your student's progress I encourage you to contact their teachers and feel free to contact me by calling the school office (740) 763-3396 or by email beerys@laca.org. I also encourage you to meet with your student's teachers on our upcoming conference nights on Monday, November 6th and Thursday, November 9th . Conferences will be held both days from 3:30 to 7:00 p.m. You will be receiving a postcard with scheduling information in the near future but feel free to contact Carma at the building office to schedule a conference. Now that all of you have parent access to Jumprope you have the ability to monitor your student's progress online all the time. If you have not yet accessed their progress online I would encourage you to do so through our website or contact Mindy Hanson at the school office.


