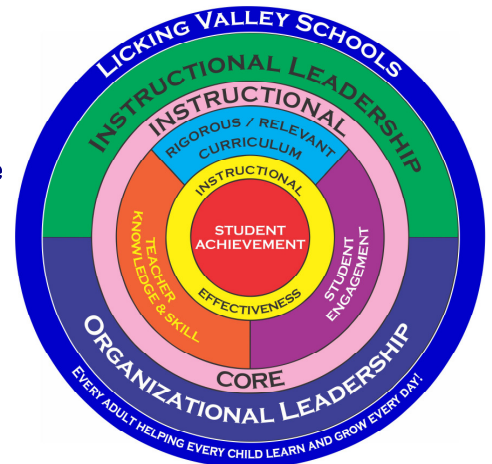

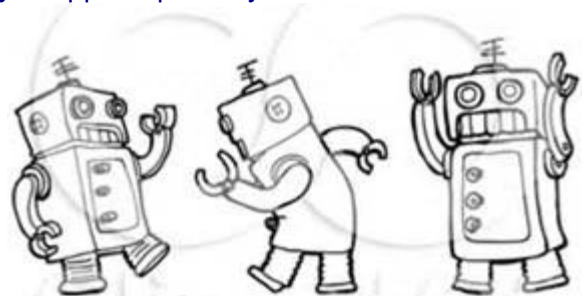

Discovery, Integration, Inclusion, Cooperation™ and Fun are the hallmarks of First Lego League (FLL) Robotics program; an International STEM based competition for students in grades 3 through 8. This past August, elementary school students Jacey Nethers, Nicholas Foltz, and Henry Shaw along with middle school students Emma Chapman and John Chapman teamed up with The Works to form The Robotic Panthers FLL team. They are coached by parents Eric Shaw and David Chapman and aided along the way by parents Yew Lin Foltz and Chris Nethers. The team met 2 to 3 times a week throughout the fall and winter and they recently wrapped up a very successful season. Here are some highlights.

With a new theme each year, teams were asked to present a project explaining how they could solve a real world issue with trash, build and program a Lego robot to complete tasks and avoid obstacles, and show how the team works well together through a “Core Values” judging.



The Robotic Panthers challenged themselves to create meaningful change within their own school district. Working with the school board, Mr. Hile and food supervisor Mrs. Jennings, the team successfully implemented a switch to a biodegradable styrofoam tray option for lunch time use. The team then created a massive 4ft x 5ft book to tell the story of their project.

The Robotic Panthers competed against 23 other area teams in a regional competition at OSU-Newark's Reece Center in mid-December. They received an award for Best Mechanical Design for their robot. They also placed 3rd place in the robot competition. Showing to be a strong, well-rounded team allowed them to be invited to central Ohio's District Tournament in Dublin in mid-January.

With a solid project score, an 11th place robot and excellent teamwork skills at the District Tournament, the Robotic Panthers were one of 12 teams selected out of 48 to advance to the State Tournament. With over 500 FLL teams in Ohio, they felt truly honored to represent Central Ohio.

Forty-eight FLL teams converged at Wright State University in early February to showcase the best Ohio had to offer. The Robotic Panthers were amazed at the creativity and ingenuity in both project and robot design of other teams. It was truly an eye opening experience for such a young team. The judges were impressed by the originality of the Robotic Panthers' presentation and solid project design. The team was awarded a 2nd place trophy (made of Legos no less) for their project presentation. Their scores in all categories improved over previous tournaments, but their robot was no match for more well seasoned teams. Their robot finished in 31st place.

This great Project-Based Learning opportunity teaches the participants so much more than just how to program a robot. Teamwork, problem solving, as well as learning about an authentic, real world issue is at the heart of any great educational experience. Other Valley students have already begun to show interest and being a part of this great opportunity. If this is something you or your child is interested in, feel free to speak to any of the team members or contact Dave Chapman for more information. The Works is another great resource. They offer a “Lego Robotics Camp” each summer. This would be an invaluable chance to learn more about building and programming robots and will give you an idea if this would be something you or your child would like to pursue.

The Robotic Panthers are already excited about next year. We do not know the specifics, but the theme will be about animals.
