# **Licking Valley Welcomes Middle School Principal**

The Licking Valley Board of Education hired Scott Beery as Middle School Principal at the June 9th Board of Education meeting.

Scott began his teaching career at Berne Union High School as a 7th/8th grade Science teacher in 1988 and then moved to Newark High School where he has been a Health & Wellness teacher for the past 19 years. He served as the head Football Coach at Newark from 2002-2007 as the



Wildcats posted back-to-back Ohio Capital Conference Championships and qualified for the Division I State Playoffs in 2005 for the first time in 30 years. Scott was awarded the Licking County Foundation's Leaders for Learning Award in 2003-2004 and was named a Franklin B. Walter Outstanding Educator recipient in 1998. He is a graduate of Lancaster High School, received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Ohio Wesleyan University, and earned his Masters of Education degree in administration from Ashland University in May of 2007. Scott and his wife Sandi are the parents of a daughter and son-in-law (Bobbi and Mark Phillips) and the proud grandparents of Ryanne Phillips who all live here in the valley. When not at school, Scott enjoys spending time with his family and running (having just completed his second marathon this past May). Scott is very much looking forward to being a part of the Licking Valley community and serving the great students and staff of the Licking Valley Local School District.
