### **Screening for Gifted** Identification

The Gifted Department of the Licking County Educational Service Center will be conducting screening for gifted identification in the visual and performing arts, specifically in areas of painting, sculpting, drawing, vocal music, instrumental music, dance or drama. According to Ohio law and district policy, students in grades kindergarten through 12th may be nominated for assessment for gifted identification . Between the months of December and February, nominated students will be evaluated using a checklist of gifted behaviors and, for those who earn a qualifying score on the checklist, a demonstration of the student's talent in fine arts.

Parents, teachers or students may nominate possible candidates for evaluation. Forms are available from the district or school office, or on the Licking County Educational Service Center Web site at www.lcesc.org/Gifted/aifted.html.

The Licking Valley School District has recently implemented the Leader Alert system to further help communicate to staff and parents information about any situation that may arise. This is a new product that will allow Licking Valley Schools to automatically contact groups of staff and parents via phone and/or email in the event that a message of some type needs to be relayed.

## School Closings

Leader Alert gives us the ability to send a voice or email message to every parent in our district with information about any situation that might arise. *This includes* snow days, early releases, and any emergencies that might occur in our schools. Here's how it works: We have taken the information parents have provided us and created a contact list for every student in the district that contains a parent phone number, parent cell phone number, and email address. We have loading this data into the Leader Alert system which enables the district to



send messages as needed. When the message is sent, your phone will ring, and once you answer and say hello

you'll hear a recorded message from Superintendent Hile. You'll be asked after the message is completed to press 1 on your phone to acknowledge the call. In addition, you should receive an email message. You don't need to reply to the email. That's all there is to it. We will use this system as needed to keep our parents notified, AND we'll be using the system soon to make daily calls to parents of students that are unexcused fron school as a reminder that your student was not in school and that an excuse is needed.

The system was tested on November 13 If you did not receive the test message and are concerned that we do not have your current information, please contact your school secretary as soon as possible so that we can update our records.




