


Licking Valley 39th Pre-Kindergarten Clinic Wed., April 10, 2013 Thur., April 11, 2013

The end of the first semester was January 17th, 2013, and we would like to take a moment to remind you that Ohio State Law requires every child between the ages of 6 and 18 be enrolled in school and his or her attendance monitored. When your child is absent from school, please call the attendance line at his/her building (available 24 hours a day) and let us know. Please make sure that upon his/her return to school that he/she has a written excuse from you, the parent, or a doctor in order for this absence to be excused. If no note is received your child is considered unexcused. When a student accumulates five (5) unexcused days in a row, or seven (7) in a thirty- day period of time, or twelve (12) in a school year, charges of delinguency and/or contributing to the unruliness of the student may be filed in Juvenile Court. The success of your child in the classroom depends on him/her being in class every day. Please make every effort to ensure your child is healthy, well-rested, and

A Walk in Someone Else's Shoes





Kayla Bayerl never thought a pair of muddy tennis shoes would make her cry. The seventh-grader had written a letter to WNCI radio host Kelsey Webb for a project, asking her to send some shoes and a letter describing a time in her life when she encountered empathy. Kayla was shocked when a pair of shoes that Webb used during a mud run arrived at Licking Valley Middle School. She was even more stunned when she read the letter that accompanied them. Webb wrote about the death of her stepmother and how her father's empathy during that time helped improve their relationship. At the end of the letter, she wrote that her father had died recently. "You never truly know how a person is feeling until you walk in their shoes." Webb wrote to Kayla, who cried reading the letter aloud. "The only thing you can offer is love and empathy."

The library at Licking Valley Middle School is full of shoes like the ones that Kayla received, many with letters about the effect of empathy. Principal Scott Beery said he hopes the shoes will inspire students to think about how they treat their classmates. "We still have work to do, but I think this has given the kids a clear perspective, in their language, to think about other people and think before they act."

This past spring, the middle school's language arts department began planning its annual summer reading program. With help from Beery, the teachers decided the program's theme would be empathy. The goal was to increase tolerance and prevent bullying, he said. "We are always trying to treat the symptoms of bullying," he said. "But you have to convey and teach kids what empathy is to stop it before it starts."

After reading books over the summer such as "Joey Pigza Swallowed the Key" and "Nightjohn," the students discussed them when they returned to school. To keep the momentum going, language arts teacher Traci Lausberg suggested a school project in which students would write to people they admire and ask them to tell a story about empathy and donate a pair of shoes. During the past few months, they've received shoes from several authors, musicians and TV personalities. Antonio Brown sent a signed pair of pink cleats that he wore for breast cancer awareness. Outdoor Channel star, Lee Lakosky sent a pair of signed camouflaged hunting boots. Some people, such as players from the Cleveland Browns, a NASCAR driver and Donald Trump haven't sent shoes, but they sent signed books, letters or other surprises.

New shoes and letters constantly are arriving at the office. Beery said he hopes the display in the library will continue to grow as students keep talking about empathy.

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) provides registration fee scholarships to children who, without this financial assistance, might not be able to participate in one of Licking County's youth recreational athletic leagues. The LMHS Youth League Scholarship program provides opportunities for area youth to participate in recreational team sports as part of our mission to improve the

health of the community. Participation in recreational team sports provides physical, mental and character-building benefits. To be eligible for the LMHS Youth League Scholarship program:

- Athlete must be a Licking County resident.
- Athlete must be age 15 or younger.
- Athlete participates in a minimum of 80% of the scheduled practices and games.
- Participation by a family member in at least one (1) volunteer opportunity during the scholarship season.

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- Athlete or parent must have completed the youth league's registration form.
- Application must be completed by a parent, guardian, or head of household, with all requested information provided.

• Application must first be reviewed by the league and recommendation provided before consideration for LMHS assistance.

The Licking Valley School District is hosting a district-wide parent meeting featuring Dr. Amy Klinger of the Educators' School Safety Network. Dr. Klinger is a nationally-recognized school safety expert. With over 24 years of experience as an educator and administrator, she brings a practitioner's perspective to the critical concerns of school crisis response, with expertise in active shooter response, crisis planning and preparedness, vulnerability assessment and mitigation, as well as lockdown enhancements, Dr. Amy Klinger combines a knowledge of law enforcement procedures with the practical experience of educational administration.

Dr. Klinger is an Assistant Professor of Educational Administration at Ashland University and is the Director of Programming for the Educators' School Safety Network Dr. Klinger will present some of the research from past school shootings and lessons learned, explain Licking Valley's vulnerability and intruder assessments, our new lockdown enhancements, and other school security improvements. Licking Valley school administrators and local first responders will also be there to answer parent questions.

This meeting follows two days of training for Licking Valley staff by Dr. Klinger and company held on September 28, 2012 and February 8, 2013. Student training will follow these sessions.

News From the Middle School

The 2013 eighth grade trip to Gettysburg is quickly approaching and we would like to remind parents of some important details of the trip so that you can plan accordingly.



150th Anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg

Dates: May 5, 6, 7, 8, 2013

Charter buses will leave from in front of the middle school at 6:00 A.M. Sunday morning. There will be an informational meeting April 18, 2013, at 7:00 P.M.in the middle school gym to discuss final details of the trip.

Cost: \$375.00 per person. The checks should be made payable to LVMS. This year there is room for a total of 216 individuals. Currently 185 are registered for the trip. There have been a number of individuals that have expressed interest in going but have not submitted a deposit. We suggest that you submit some portion of a deposit to reserve your spot. The date for us to give our final list to the company that handles the reservations is rapidly approaching.

Chaperones: We highly encourage parents to go as their son/ daughter's chaperone. We also have had grandparents, aunts, uncles and older brothers/sisters go as chaperones. The age requirement is they must be at least 24 years-old. If you are going as a chaperone on the trip you need to get an appointment made at the district office to get a background check. This is not an additional cost to you, but you will need to have your driver's license and call for an appointment time. The number is: 763-2911 or 763-3525

Rooming: Rooming sign-up sheets will be passed out in March. At this time students will be instructed to submit their request within the week. The room should include their adult chaperone, themselves and two (2) friends for a total of four (4). We will do everything we can to honor their request but please understand that the room must have an adult and we would prefer that the adult is someone they are familiar with. If your son/daughter is going and you are not going with them, we ask that you help with the rooming process by helping them decide who their adult chaperone will be.

<u>Grades/behavior:</u> Please remind your son/daughter about the agreement that was signed and how important it is for them to be ever mindful of their grades and behavior so they do not lose their privilege of going on the trip.

LVHS GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT NEWS

It is time to begin scheduling for the 2013-2014 school year. The process will be different for your student this year than it has been in the past.

Sophomores will have a whole group informational meeting about scheduling on **Tuesday, February 5** with the counselors. Each student will then have an individual scheduling meeting with their counselor between February 13-19. Students will discuss their career interests, PLAN (practice ACT) results, MyMajors (career interest inventory) results and academic history with their counselor and work to select an academic major for their junior and senior year. We will also work with the student to select courses based upon their major of choice and their remaining graduation requirements.

Tuesday, February 26 at 7:00 P.M., we will have an informational meeting for sophomore parents in the school auditorium. We will be discussing the academic majors program and providing each parent with their student's individual PLAN scores, MyMajors results, academic transcript, major and course selection. Parents will be invited to make individual appointments with their student's counselor if they have any questions or concerns or would like to make any changes.

We are asking that all scheduling changes and counselor meetings relating to majors and scheduling be done by Friday, March 8.

All sophomore students will select a major and courses for next year. Those who are later accepted to C-TEC will have their schedule pulled at the time that decision is made.

Post-Secondary Educational Options Thursday, February 7 at 6:00 P.M. LVHS Auditorium

Students who are interested in participating in the PSEO program next year should attend with a parent. The PSEO program allows students in 9th through 12th grade to attend classes on a college campus to earn college credit while in high school. This is a State of Ohio program and the state requires attendance of a parent or guardian at this informational meeting, in order for a student to participate. If you have attended one of these meetings in a previous year, you do not need to come again, unless you are looking to refresh yourself on the information.

Licking Valley also offers multiple Advanced Placement (AP) courses and a Kenyon Academic Partnership (KAP) English course in which it is possible for high school students to earn college credits. We will also be discussing these options. Attendance at the meeting is not required for participation in AP or KAP, although we do think it is beneficial.
