Did You Know?

- 71.3% of LVHS students report using alcohol in the past year.
- 47.5% report using tobacco in the past year.
- 27.0% report using marijuana in the past year.
- The average age LVHS students report first using tobacco at 12.5 years; first use of alcohol at 13.3 years and first use of marijuana at 13.4 years.
- LVHS students report that the place where they are most likely to use tobacco, alcohol and marijuana is at a friend's house, and the place where they are least likely to use the same substances is at school.

Flu Symptoms

Here is some basic information regarding flu symptoms. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, influenza symptoms may include:

- Fever**
- Cough**
- Fatigue**
- Headache**
- Sore Throat**
- Stuffy or Runny Nose**
- Muscle Aches**
- Diarrhea and vomiting** (this alone is not considered influenza)

Staying home to avoid spreading to others, drinking lots of fluids, plenty of rest, hand washing with soap and water (20 seconds) and covering a cough will help decrease the spread of flu symptoms.

Should your child experience these symptoms,

call your health care professional regarding treatment. Any medication containing aspirin or "salicylates" to anyone under age 20 has been linked to Reye's syndrome, which can be life threatening. Ask your physician which medication is safe to use.

The Licking County Health Department can still help you and your family with flu vaccine, their phone number is 349-6535. The Newark City Health Department phone number is 349-6680. Either department will help for a low fee of \$7.00, or for free if unable to pay.

As you are reporting your child off school for illness, please let us know if child has flu symptoms. As a school we are required to report high percentages of absenteeism because of flu to the health department.

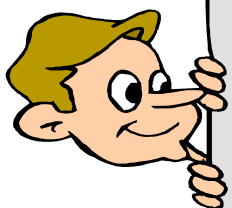
