ENTION PARENTS AND STUDENT ATHLETES Memorial Hospital to offer free sports physical to all

athletes grades 7-12. Boys physicals will be on June 4th, girls will be on June 8th. Both days, physicals will start at 5:00. A parent must be in attendance in order to participate. There is a big change in regards to the physical forms this year that we need to make you aware of. Packets are available in the high school and middle school offices that contain the paperwork necessary for the free EKG screenings that are conducted at LMH. You can also find that paperwork here:

These forms are only needed if you plan to participate in the LMH physicals. If you wish to see your own physician instead, you will not need to fill out these forms. Please be advised, you will not need to participate in ImPACT testing during these physicals because it will be done here at Licking Valley for all athletes in football, HS volleyball, soccer, HS basketball, wrestling, baseball, and softball. Other sports are not mandated to test due to the lower risk of concussion, but if you wish to have your child tested please feel free to call the high school at 763-3252, and we will be happy to schedule a time for your child to be tested.

Type Licking Valley in the search box and follow instructions on how to fill out the form. You will need to fill out this form, print it, and present it on the night of physicals. This form is a bit lengthy and will take some time to fill out, so plan accordingly so you are prepared. This new process may seem tedious, but we highly recommend you use this form, even if you are not participating in the LMH physicals, because your child's medical information will be more secure with this form, it simplifies the process in future since the site will save all your information, and it allows our medical staff the ability to see any information in your child's history they may need to know during an evaluation on the sideline.

We know this is a big change and can be confusing, so if you have any guestions about the process, the **PrivIT** help desk will be able to help you with any issues on the physical. Their information can be found on their website. You can also call the high school at 740-763-3721 with any concerns.

New Educational Options Program at LVHS

We are excited to announce that under our Educational Options Policy, the Licking Valley Schools is launching a new Educational Options program. This program will provide new and exciting opportunities for all LVHS students. We have partnered with ACE Digital Academy, an online curriculum and education provider to offer up to 200 online courses to our high school students. This program is designed to meet two basic needs. One need is to help the roughly 7% of our students who do not graduate each year. Many of these students are, for one reason or another, unable to succeed in the traditional high school instructional program and environment. This online option will provide them with an alternative to the traditional high school program and give them another avenue to earn their Licking Valley High School diploma. We would like to bring back to Licking Valley our students who are currently enrolled in other online, community and charter school programs, and students who have dropped out of LVHS but who really want a diploma from Licking Valley High School. If you know a former LV student who didn't graduate, please share this information with them. Licking Valley currently loses almost \$350,000.00 annually to community and charter schools such as Newark Digital Academy when our students drop out and enroll in those schools, and the vast majority of them never acquire a diploma of any kind.

The other need is to offer additional internet–based elective courses to all of our students. These electives include various foreign languages such as French, German, Japanese, Latin and Mandarin Chinese. There are also electives such as art history, business and technology, Microsoft Office Software courses, career exploration and various Advanced Placement (AP) courses not currently available at the school. There is also an online ACT Preparation course available through this program. We will also be able to offer credit recovery and summer school courses through the Educational Options program!

The Children's Reading Foundation of Licking County

Remember that you are your child's first and best teacher, and over the long summer months when students are not in school, you are there ONLY teacher. You can keep your student's academic skills sharp with an hour or less of reading and math per day. Establish a time during the day when your elementary child is required to read for at least 20 minutes per day and do 20 minutes of math practice appropriate to their skill level, and at least 30 minutes per day for your middle schooler or high schooler. Think about that . . . for an hour or less a day your child can continue learning and growing over the summer and come back to school ready to start a new, challenging school year. If you need books for your child, come into our District Office, or call at 763-3525, and we will get you books appropriate to the age and skill of your child. For math exercises check the internet, there are a number of websites that offer math practice items for free, like khanacademy.org. If you are able to pay a small fee, IXL.com is an excellent website for math practice and one with which your child will be familiar because we use it here at school in elementary through middle school. It's not asking too much of your child to continue learning and growing over the summer. Make it part of their daily routine, you'll feel good about it and they'll be better off because of it. Remember, every adult helping every child learn and grow every day is our vision, and you are part of 'every adult' and the summer days are part of 'every day'!


