Licking Valley Winter Sports in Review

The Winter sports season is coming to a close and Licking Valley teams enjoyed another successful season.

The boys basketball team finished the season 3-11 in MSL-Ohio play and 4 -18 overall. Wins this season came against Lakewood, Utica and Heath twice. Junior Scott Morris earned second team all-MSL honors and senior Devin Carr earned honorable men-

tion. The four seniors on the team were Devin Carr, Chris Flanagan, Drew McArtor and Ryan Shepherd.

The girls basketball team finished their season with a 9-5 record in MSL-Ohio play which tied them for third place and a 13-9 overall record. This earned them the #9 seed in the central district tournament. They defeated Beechcroft in round one and then were defeated by Hartley in the second round. Junior Cassie Stein earned first team all-MSL, sophomore Kori Caughenbaugh earned second team and junior Brittany Wilson earned honorable mention. The four seniors on the team were CheyAnn Cramer, Ashley Haren, Kassia Johnson and Kailey Rutherford.

The wrestling team had another successful season finishing second in the MSL-Ohio and second at the sectional tournament. Senior Caleb Nethers was the lone wrestler to earn first team all-MSL. Earning second team were senior Nathan McCown, junior Blake Owens, sophomore Bo Redman and freshmen Jaqui Van Meter. Honorable mention went to senior Steven Nethers, senior Tommy Wogan, junior Justin Winland and sophomore Kolton Chesser. Nine total wrestlers qualified for the district tournament with three advancing to the state tournament this Thursday, Friday and Saturday at the Ohio State University. Those advancing to the state tournament are senior Nathan McCown, junior Blake Owens and junior Logan Johnson.

Junior Wyatt Wortkoetter was the lone swimmer from Licking Valley and he had a very successful season. Wyatt advanced to the district championships in both the 200 Free and the 100 Fly. He placed 6th in the 200 Free earning a medal and a place on the podium.

Our club bowling teams finished their seasons at the sectional tournament. On the boy's team, senior Jared Schindler earned first team all-MSL honors and junior Matt Hartshorn earned second team. On the girl's team, sophomore Cierra Lewis earned honorable mention and sophomore Katelynn Thompson qualified for the District tournament.

LVHS Student Creates Anti-Bullying Blog by Emily Maddern, Advocate Reporter

Haley Smith knows what it feels like to be bullied.

When she was in elementary school, kids used to tease her about her red hair and freckles and even stole her glasses.

"I had all of these people making fun of me. It was really hard to deal with sometimes," said Smith, now 16 and a sophomore at Licking Valley High School.

Her experiences led her to develop a passion for raising awareness about bullying and doing whatever she could to stop bullying from happening. But she was never sure of where to start until her pastor, Jason Watson, of Crossroads

Church of Christ in Newark, asked members of the church's youth group to think about what they could do to change the world.

That was when Smith was inspired to create her anti-bullying blog, "Calling Them Weak Won't Make You Strong," where she shares her experiences with bullying and tries to reach out to others and educate people on how they can make a difference.

"The blog is really about going to people and showing them they're not alone," Smith said. "I know I would have wanted that."

Smith said her favorite post so far has been the one she wrote about "closet bullying" because it's an aspect of bullying that people would be most surprised about. Closet bullying occurs when someone says something bad about another person behind his or her back, the every day gossip people don't realize can hurt someone.

A lot of people wouldn't think of gossiping as a form of bullying, Smith said, but words can be just as hurtful as physically bullying someone.

"You never know when that's going to get back to someone," she said. "You should never single someone out."

Although she has been blogging for only about a month, Smith said she already has received some positive feedback from people who have visited the site. Hearing from readers who she is helping and inspiring them has meant a lot to her, and she hopes to continue expanding the site during the next few months, she said.

"I always look forward to writing on it. It really shows me what I've overcome," Smith said.

The most important thing Smith hopes her blog will accomplish is to inspire others to stand up and speak out against bullying, ending every post ends with a simple call to action: "Make a difference today. Speak up, I am."


