- The Licking Valley Local School District has not been on the ballot for 23 years to ask for operating dollars.
- The Licking Valley Local School District for the third year in a row (thanks to our treasurer, Jo Lynn Torbert) has received the *Auditor of State Award.* This award is given to those entities that file timely financial reports in accordance with GAAP, as well as receive a "clean" audit report.
- The first class to graduate from Licking Valley Local School District was in 1959.
- The 2015-16 Licking Valley 5th graders raised money to pay for cleft palate surgery for two children in third world countries this Christmas.
- The Panthers Lego Robotics Team, affiliated with The Works, was one of 48 teams selected from 500 statewide to compete at the Ohio FIRST LEGO League competition two weeks ago at Wright State University. This first year team, made up of middle school students Emma Chapman and John Chapman, and intermediate students Nicholas Foltz, Henry Shaw and Jacey Nethers, placed 2nd in the state for their project, and got their highest score in the robot competition. Advisers for the team are Dave Chapman, LVHS math teacher, Eric Shaw and Chris Nethers, LV Elementary music teacher. WOW, what an accomplishment! Congratulations to everyone!



STEMfest is centered around Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics and provides students with real-world problem solving challenges and materials and encourages teams to find the best solutions. Students present their solutions to a live audience and panel of judges. Awards are presented to teams with top honors, and all students receive certificates to add to their career passports.

All three teams entered the Home Energy Challenge where they were given the frame of a scale model house and challenged to insulate it in the best way possible to hold the most heat.

The Fearsome Threesome placed 4th with 59.73 points, Triple Turtle Takedown placed 5th with 59.37 points, and The Z placed 6th with 56.03 points.



Ainsley Decker was also nominated for the Persistent Scientist Award for diligent work on her project. Several other students from around the county were nominated as well. Of all the applicants, Ainsley was chosen as the 2016 Middle School Persistent Scientist. Congratulations to Ainsley!



March is Women's History Month

2016 Theme:

"Working to Form a More Perfect Union: Honoring Women in Public Service and Government"

Women's History Month in the United States grew out of a weeklong celebration of women's contributions to culture, history and society organized by the school district of Sonoma, <u>California</u>, in 1978. Presentations were given at dozens of schools, hundreds of students participated in a "Real Woman" essay contest and a parade was held in downtown Santa Rosa.

A few years later, the idea had caught on within communities, school districts and organizations across the country. In 1980, President <u>Jimmy Carter</u> issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. The U.S. Congress followed suit the next year, passing a resolution establishing a national celebration. Six years later, the National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress to expand the event to the entire month of March.




