The winning teachers each earn a personalized plaque plus \$500. Each nominated student earned a plaque as well.




The annual event honors one teacher from the majority of Licking County's school districts, plus one teacher from Newark Catholic and the Licking County Educational Service Center.

In recognizing the most innovative products, the annual *District Administration* Readers' Choice Top 100 Products award informs superintendents and other senior school district leaders about products their colleagues around the country are using to help their districts excel.

National Children's Reading Foundation President Nancy Kerr said, "We are thrilled to be recognized as a Top 100 program. It's a tremendous honor administrators using *READY!* for *Kindergarten* recommended it to their colleagues through this prestigious publication. This award is yet another validation of the powerful impact of our early learning program and its ability to ensure children succeed in school."

*READY!* for Kindergarten, which provides trainings, targets and tools to parents of children birth to age five, is offered in the Licking Valley Schools, as well as in over 25 states and 110 school districts across the country. It is a research-based and proven program, helping ensure children start kindergarten at grade level and read proficiently by 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, a strong indicator of future success in school and in life.

"The *READY! for Kindergarten* program directly correlates with the skills we need our incoming kindergarteners to possess when they enter school for the first time," said David Hile, Superintendent, Licking Valley Local Schools. "Our vision is: Every adult helping every child learn and grow every day! This program is about the school district taking responsibility for helping parents help their children learn and grow every day beginning at birth."

"Parents and caregivers of children who attend *READY!* classes leave with materials to use at home to build preliteracy and school readiness skills," said Virginia Paine, National Director of *READY!* for *Kindergarten*. "Studies show nearly 80% of children whose parents take part in *READY!* meet the kindergarten reading readiness standard regardless of family income or ethnicity, compared to 55% of children whose parents do not attend."

"Every year 40% of children start kindergarten already one to three years behind. They struggle to catch-up, and most of them never will," Kerr said. "We hope this award brings further attention to the importance of the *READY!* for Kindergarten program and inspires more parents to attend classes and prepare their children to start kindergarten at grade level."




#### **ELEMENTARY FAMILY** LITERACY NIGHT
