2010 Operation Feed Campaign

The 2010 Licking Valley Operation Feed campaign was another successful one. All three buildings worked hard and in the end were triumphant. Each year the food pantry awards the highest scoring schools with a traveling trophy. For the first year the middle school won the award. The LEO club, under the supervision of Mary Stafford, ended the campaign with 17,972 points. For the second year in a row, the elementary school was a winner. They finished the campaign with 37,649 points. The coordinators for the elementary were Kate Anderson and Kristy Gossett. Under the leadership of the Student Council and their advisors



Brianna Stout and Lindsay Conley, the high school produced its best campaign ever with 41,386 points and procuring the trophy for the third year in a row. April 23, 2010 and collected the trophies. Each building's trophy is on display in the respective libraries for a year.

CHINA: An Incredible Professional and Personal Experience

As most of you know by now, I was selected last July to participate in the China Exchange Initiative, a program that selects applicants from America's education administrators to participate in an exchange with Chinese education administrators for the purpose of professional growth for the administrators and to perpetuate cultural understanding between these two great countries. As a part of this exchange program, Mr. Zhu, the principal of Wuhan Middle School #26 spent a week in our district and in my home last November, 2009. It was a truly wonderful experience for our faculty and students and exceeded all of my expectations. Mr. Zhu and I became fast friends and colleagues and spent a great deal of time discussing and comparing our respective education systems.

On April 7, 2010, I left for a two and half week trip to China to experience their history and culture and to study their education system. Our trip was organized around visits to four cities in China. Our first stop was in the ancient capital of Xi'an where we learned a great deal about China's ancient history and visited a peasant village named Pangliu. The next stop was Beijing where we met with the National Education Ministry and visited various schools and universities and the famous Forbidden City among other incredible attractions. Our third stop was in our host district, so I was reunited with my friend Mr. Zhu who graciously hosted me in his home in Wuhan, a city of 9 million people in Hubei Province. Here I spent the week visiting Wuhan MS #26 and other primary and secondary schools in Wuhan. In addition, Mr. Zhu treated me to visits to all of Wuhan's incredible attractions including the Yellow Crane Tower, East Lake, the Peony Flower Park, a boat tour on the famous Yangtze River and to wonderful Chinese meals at various restaurants when his wife wasn't cooking me delicious traditional meals at home. The week concluded with a traditional dumpling meal with Mr. Zhu's entire extended family. Spending a week with Mr. Zhu and his family was a wonderful, authentic cultural experience and a personal experience I will never forget. I left Wuhan feeling like I now have a surrogate family in China. On the professional side, we have initiated a relationship that both Mr. Zhu and I have committed to growing and expanding to positively impact our respective faculties and students in the years to come through additional exchanges.

It is really very difficult for me to put into words at this point exactly what this experience meant to me both personally and professionally. As I reflect on it over the coming weeks and months, I hope it gets easier to summarize it for others. Right now, the best I can do is this: China is a country with an incredible culture built over the long course of 5,000 years by incredibly industrious people, and when you are immersed in that culture, you can't help but feel its depth and breadth and sense its richness in the language, the food, the traditions and the cultural norms.

You also learn very quickly how proud and reverent the Chinese people are of their history and culture. At every historical and cultural attraction we visited, from the history museums, the Terra Cotta Warrior archeological site to the raising of the flag at Tiananmen Square at sunrise, we were outnumbered by hundreds, and in some cases thousands, of Chinese citizens.

As proud as the Chinese people are of their culture, you also sense a genuine openness and welcoming to other people, their cultures and their ideas. In fact, as I wrote on my blog, contrary to what we often read or hear in the news media about the disdain with which Americans are supposedly viewed around the world, I found all of the Chinese people I met and interacted with to be genuinely respectful and admiring, and almost in awe of America and Americans. Indeed, I have never been treated with more respect and admiration anywhere at any time in my life.

I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has been so supportive of my taking this trip. I have really been overwhelmed with the number of people in the Licking

Valley School community who were genuinely positive and excited about me going to China and who are now genuinely interested in learning about the trip.

I am eager to demonstrate my appreciation for that support by sharing my experience with interested students, parents, staff and community members. I will be doing a photo presentation for everyone interested in touring China through my pictures on Wednesday, June 2, 2010 from 7-9 pm at the Licking Valley High School Library/Media Center. I hope you will join me; I think you'll enjoy it!
