Leaders for Learning Award




Some of the community's very best educators were recently recognized for inspiring future generations of citizens with the Licking County Foundation's annual Leaders for Learning Award. Fourteen area teachers were surprised in their classrooms recently by representatives of the Licking County Foundation who presented them with an art-glass apple symbolizing the knowledge and inspiration they impart to their students and the community's appreciation for their efforts. Licking Valley's Jeff Wills was one of the award recipients.

Jeff has served the children of LVMS for over 30 years. Throughout this time Jeff has been an extraordinary student-focused teacher that has always gone above and beyond in tailoring his instruction to meet the individual needs of each and every student. He has changed his practice throughout the years not because he was ineffective, but because he discovered a new way or a new tool to reach our students. Jeff Wills is the embodiment of our vision statement of "Every Adult Helping Every Child Learn and Grow Every Day".

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Recently in the news media you may have noticed stories concerning lead levels in the drinking water throughout Ohio.

I would like to address the concern and update everyone on the current status of lead and copper water samples that are collected throughout the drinking water distribution systems at the Licking Valley School District.



The district operates two water plants on a daily basis that supply safe drinking water to each location. The first water plant is located at the elementary school and the second is located at the high school. The elementary location supplies water to the elementary school, middle school, district office and a portion of the athletic fields. The high school location supplies water to the high school and the athletic field house. Both of these locations must comply with the Ohio EPA safe drinking water standards. Each year we are required to collect various water samples that are indicated on an annual monitoring schedule. Once collected, they are sent to a certified lab for testing to see if they are over or under the MCL (maximum contamination level). If the sample is over the MCL, we are required to notify the consumer and to start our corrective action plan.

The district has been collecting lead and copper samples from each water plant from the day that we occupied the new high school (2000) and the elementary location (2007), the same water plant that supplies water to the middle school. At the onset of moving into each location we were required to collect twenty samples from various locations throughout the buildings to determine the level (if any) of lead and copper within the distribution system. The samples were sent to the lab for testing and determined to be below the standard. This process continued for the first four years that the buildings were in service. Once the systems were deemed safe from lead and copper, we were scheduled triennially on lead and copper samples. Our most recent triennial samples were collected (2014) at each location and were less than 5 ug/L (parts per billion). The action level (unsafe) for lead is 15 ug/L (ppb).

In other words, here at Licking Valley, we have been testing our water for these contaminates and managing our water supplies to ensure safe drinking for our students and staff for many years now. The water in the Licking Valley Schools is safe to drink. Please let us know if you ever have questions or concerns.

- For the start of 2016-2017 school year the state of Ohio is requiring the Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines for 7th grade student attendance to public schools.
- Exceptions must be filed with school prior to the start of school year.

"The Importance of Self-Advocacy for Kids With Learning and Attention Issues"

(Content from article written by Andrew M.I. Lee, J.D. editor and former attorney)

In his article, Mr. Lee discusses the importance of a child being able to speak up for their own needs. It is important that every child understands their strengths and weaknesses and knows what they need to succeed and communicates that to other people.

The skill of self-advocacy has a few key elements:

- * Your child understands their needs.
- * Your child *knows* what help or support will address those needs, like tutoring or a classroom accommodation.
- * Your child can *communicate* their needs to teachers and others.

Because self-advocacy is important, you can take steps to help your child build this skill. Here are some ways to help your child develop self-advocacy skills:

- 1. Talk with your child about their strengths and weaknesses.
- 2. Remind them that asking for help is a good thing.
- 3. Praise them for speaking up when they need help.
- 4. Teach your child how to talk about their rights in a positive, constructive way.
- 5. Encourage your child to use the classroom accommodations they are entitled to.
- 6. When a problem arises, give your child a chance to solve it before stepping in.
- 7. Let your child have a say in decisions about their education.
- 8. If your child has an IEP, invite them to attend the IEP meetings.

Self-advocacy isn't easy for many kids, so practice can help your child learn self-advocacy. Self-advocacy can help your child deal with their current challenges and the ones they may face in the future.





About ExploraVision More than just a student science competition Since its inception in 1992, more than 350,000 students from across the United States and Canada have participated in Toshiba/NSTA ExploraVision. It's a fun and engaging program that can inspire a lifelong love of science, technology and innovation for students and teachers alike. What is Explo-



raVision? The ExploraVision competition for K-12 students engages the next generation in real world problem solving with a strong emphasis on STEM. ExploraVision challenges students envision and communicate new technology 20 years in the future through collaborative brain-storming and research of current science and technology.

Two teams from Licking Valley Middle School were chosen as 2016 Toshiba/NSTA ExploraVision Honorable Mention Winners. The Toshiba/NSTA Exploravision competition allows students to use science, technology and their imaginations to design plans for an invention that will help in some way in the future.

John Chapman, Ainsley Decker, and Nathaniel Higgins, with their invention of the Flo Phones, were awarded this honor. Flo Phones are a type of headphone device that you wear that taps into your brainwaves to play music depending on your mood. Also, Rachel Lee and Delaina McWilliams, with their invention of the NT004- Neurotransmitter 2004, were awarded this honor. The NT004 is a small device that will tap into your brainwaves to help you speak if you have a disability that does not allow you to speak.

The Honorable Mention award places them in the top10% of all Exploravision projects submitted to the competition this year. Only 4 teams from Ohio were on the Honorable Mention list this year, and 2 were from Licking Valley!

Teams received certificates and a Solar Globe as prizes in the competition. They are certainly commended for a job well done in demonstrating innovative thinking in their exploration of science and its impact on technology and the future.
