



The online driver education course costs \$79.00, and the required



eight (8) hours of in-car driving instruction will cost \$329.00. The combined cost is a savings of approximately \$60 over other local options. Students will also be eligible to receive one-half () elective academic credit for completion of the program, including the driving portion. o receive credit students simply have to complete both the online instruction modules and the eight hours of driving instruction and bring their certificate of completion to their guidance counselor.

The in-car driving instructors are local citizens who we know and who are licensed in the state of Ohio to provide driving instruction, and who will have regular criminal background checks to ensure the safety of our students.

If you have a busy teenager who doesn't have time to get to and sit through in-class driver education courses, this is an excellent option for you, especially when your student has their own personal computer. If you are interested in pursuing this option simply go to this website https://www.allstardriveredonline.com/register.php?id=24 and create an account, and when your student is ready to do the in-car driving instruction just have him or her contact Jane McKee at the district office, 763-3525.



Many students do understand the importance of school and learning and some do not. Therefore, some students do not work up to their potential in school. It can be hard to convince students that there can be problems ahead when they do not study or complete work in school. Their future outside of school seems so far away at times.

Earning power is directly connected to the amount of education a student receives in their lifetime. The Department of Labor provided the following information on mean weekly earnings for people 18 and over in a 2010 report. These statistics are ranked by the highest level of education:

\$1,532.00	Doctoral Degree
\$1,257.00	Master's Degree
\$1,028.00	Bachelor's Degree
\$761.00	Associate Degree
\$626.00	High School Diploma

A study of high school dropouts showed that the longer a student spends in school, the more income they earned. More school, more income! Education plays an important part in lifelong success and future earning power. It also means they will be less likely to be unemployed. It is important to encourage all students to do their very best in school and set some personal goals which include technical school or some college.

It is a competition that challenges and inspires students to become the next generation of scientists, researchers, educated voters, policy makers, and environmentally-minded citizens. Dawes Arboretum in Newark is sponsoring the Fairchild Challenge for Licking County and the surrounding area.

Students in middle schools and high schools around the country and the world are given 4 challenges to complete throughout the year.
