#### LVHS FOOTBALL GAME WITH THE CANADIAN TEAM:

There has been some speculation surrounding LVHS' football game with the Canadian school, Bishop Ryan Secondary, on Friday, September 7, and the costs associated with playing a team from out of the country. First, contracting with a team to come to our facility for a game, especially when it is a one-time event, rather than a home and away deal like we had with Beechcroft the past two years, is nothing new or unusual. In fact, it was the same type of contract the athletic department had with North Canton Hoover for our game up there on August 31, which was one-time event, and for which the North Canton Hoover Athletic Department paid our athletic department \$3,500.00. We had a similar contract with the team from Cincinnati we played in a one-game event a couple of years ago.

In these one-game contracts, it is usually agreed upon to share some of the gate receipts and compensate the visiting team for mileage costs, all of which comes directly from the gate receipts of the game, <u>which is athletic budget funds</u>, not general fund mon-<u>ies</u>. The contract with the Canadian team was no different, except that because they were coming so far, it was agreed that our athletic department would pay for their stay at a local hotel, the money for which also comes from the game's gate receipts. After these expenses, the athletic fund receives the remainder of the gate receipts, which in this case equaled \$5,618.00. This is all a bonus to our athletic fund because it comes from a sixth home football game, whereas in most years we would have only five home games. So the Licking Valley Athletic Department made money on the game with Bishop Ryan Secondary, and none of this money comes from or goes to the district's general fund!

## **Did You Know?**

- Our first day of school in the Licking Valley Elementary Facility will be on Monday, October 22, 2007.
- Once we move into the new facility, we will no longer need to transfer buses as students will be taken directly to school on the bus that picks them up.
- There will be 330 new computers in the new facility which includes four student machines per room and two computer labs.
- The beautiful brick sculpture displayed on the new facility was designed by Alan Moran and donated by Bowerston Shale to depict the four elementary buildings coming together as Licking Valley Elementary. Bowerston also donated two additional sculptures designed by Alan to be displayed inside the building. We are very grateful and thankful for this generous donation.
- There are 89 Junior and Seniors at C-TEC this year.
- The average ACT score of LVHS students in 2007 was a 21.2. The state average was 21.6 and the National Average was 21.2.
- Duane Flowers, Mayor of Hanover organized the fireworks display at the LV football games. The fireworks are made possible by private corporate donations and local volunteer fireman are there to ensure the safety of our fans.
- Licking Valley Local School District has made a reduction in staff of 30 people since 2004 through attrition, retirements, resignations, and consolidation.
- LVLSD saved \$38,000.00 on its new office copier machines lease and replaced all machines with new high efficiency copiers in all buildings.
