

### LV Staff Trained in Gunshot Wound Management

No one working in a school just 5 years ago would have ever imagined that someday he/she would be required to learn how to manage gunshot wounds to possibly help save students' or co-workers lives inside a school building, but in 2014 gunshot wound management is now a vitally important lifesaving skill for school personnel. Law enforcement personnel will tell you that after a school shooting occurs, the most important skill needed immediately on site is the ability to quickly assess wounds and stop the bleeding. On Friday, August 22, the entire Licking Valley District staff was trained in gunshot wound management by Troy Lowe, Licking County SWAT Team medic and firefighter. Staff members were taught the lifesaving importance of quickly stopping the bleed-



ing of gunshot wound victims using readily available materials for wound plugs, patches and tourniquets. Troy is a hands-on style instructor and very quickly got all staff members involved in actually practicing the application of his basic techniques. After five 1-hour sessions to complete the training of all staff members, our people are now better prepared to save the life of another school community member in the event of a school shooting. One more skill in our tool kit to help us do our most important job – keeping everyone safe – and one more that we hope we never have to use. Remember, if you see something, say something! If you ever acquire information about someone thinking about, talking about, writing about or in any way threatening to harm someone or others in the school community, please contact a school administrator immediately and share what you know so that we can investigate it.

#### **Parent & Teacher Partnerships in the Inclusive Classroom**


As our special needs students head back to school for a new year, we all want these students to experience success at the highest possible level. Many of our classrooms contain students with a variety of special conditions like ADD, Autism, hearing and vision impairments, communication challenges, and other special learning needs.

Parents are valuable assets to the school and the classroom teacher. As teachers strive to meet the educational needs of your child, your support is essential. Parents are one of a teacher's best resources when it comes to school success. Below I have listed some strategies that parents can use to create partnerships with their child's teachers in the inclusive classroom.

- 1. Inform the school. Let them know any special needs your child may have.
- **2. Meet with the teacher.** Do this as soon as possible. Share important information about your child.
- **3.** Develop a communication strategy. Determine the best way (s) to communicate with your child's teacher to share updates and information.
- 4. Share capabilities. Let the teacher know some of your child's overall strengths, weaknesses, and interests.
- 5. Prepare for the IEP meetings. Write down any questions and concerns you have. Share the goals and hopes you have for your child.
- 6. Provide essential information. Share information from any outside evaluations, medical information, or support services that are relative to your child.
- 7. Offer constructive feedback. Indicate what has worked best for your child and what hasn't. Teachers can take this information into consideration when reflecting on their daily practices and instructional strategies.

A parent's active participation in the education of their special needs child is invaluable. The sharing of knowledge, resources, and information can help ensure the best possible learning environment for the student. Together, parents and teachers can create a pathway to student success. ### **1985 FIELD HOUSE RE-BORN**

As most of you know, in March of 2013 our primary (at the time) field house burned down just as we were completing the construction of our new larger field house. The building had been built in 1985 through the leadership and efforts of Athletic Booster President Larry Crothers. The building served the district athletic department well for almost 30 years. The fire started in the electrical system but the inspector was never able to pinpoint the exact cause. Nonetheless, the building provided needed space as

a locker room (although there weren't many lockers in it, except those built by hand by Mark Bretz) and had to be replaced. Even with the addition of the brand new large field house, we had planned to utilize the 1985 building for locker rooms for our middle school and freshman athletes, and as our guest locker room. This week, the week of Aug. 25, Paul Construction, from Zanesville, completed the rebuilding project, with the exception of a few minor punch list items that will be completed soon. The building was built on the same footprint as the 1985 building but we did add some interior walls to create some separate spaces. The exterior matches the rest of our buildings on the campus (Bowerston Shale brick!) and inside we have two separate locker rooms, one for middle school and one for our freshman athletes, either of which can double as a guest locker room. Additionally, the building contains two large storage areas, one on each end, and of course there are restrooms and showers and an officials changing room. We hated to lose the '85 building because it was built with the blood, sweat and tears of Licking Valley people,



and for sentimental reasons - there were a lot of great halftime speeches given inside those four walls - but as is often the case in life, a loss or a challenge frequently offers new opportunities – the district took this opportunity to again improve our facilities for our students.
